## Preamble

Successful implementation of a community engagement activity demands thorough and layered engagement with stakeholders at all levels. The planned community resilience mapping exercise in Jur River County faced many challenges such as lack of trust between different communities, security challenges due to the presence of various factions and government security apparatus, and absence of confidence in foreign organizations.

The Policy LINK team adhered to its stakeholder engagement strategy to mitigate these risks and challenges through defined community entry points and methodical and layered engagement with the key actors. This strategy set the platform for building trust between Policy LINK and the county government institutions, traditional authorities, civil society, and the private sector. The end goal of the engagement strategy was to promote and enable a culture of transparency, accountability, and joint action planning.

In compliance with Policy LINK's commitment to work with the four corners of the community, including Traditional Leaders, Local Government, Civil Society and Private Sector, the team met with Payam Administrators, security officers, traditional authorities, the private sector, and women and youth representatives. In total, Policy LINK engaged with 54 people, among whom were seven women, representing a large, under-represented women's group.

## **State-Level Stakeholder Engagement**

Upon arrival in the state, the Policy LINK team first met with the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) State Coordinator and briefed him on Policy LINK's planned activities in Jur River County. They also briefed him on the initial engagements with the NBS in Juba that culminated in the production of enumeration areas and maps for the Enumeration Area (EA) maps in Jur River County, an approach that was appreciated by the State Coordinator.

He also appreciated that theirs was the first stop for Policy LINK prior to engaging other state and county stakeholders. This is because the NBS usually assigns an office representative to accompany field teams as they engage stakeholders and collect data. The State Coordinator also shared a letter from the Governor for Policy LINK's use.

Other engagements with state-level stakeholders included meetings with the Deputy Chair of the Relief and Rehabilitation Commission (RRC), Director of Public Service, and Honorable Commissioner for Jur River County, who is currently working from Wau. The meetings aimed to socialize them with Policy LINK activities in Jur River County and get their support and facilitation as appropriate. As a result of these engagements, Policy LINK got prompt approval to advertise for the recruitment of enumerators and mobilizers from the Public Service Office.

## Payam Level Stakeholder Engagement

### Introduction of Policy LINK in Jur River County

From August 13 – 18, 2021 the Policy LINK team visited the six payams of Jur River County to meet with payam-level stakeholders. These payams include Kangi, Udici, Wau Bai, Marial Bai, Rocrocdong, and Kuajiena.

The purpose of the meetings was to introduce Policy LINK and brief the different stakeholders of Policy LINK activities that will be held between August and December 2021. In these meetings, the Policy LINK team was accompanied by the NBS representative and two locally recruited Dinka and Luo translators.

The team held meetings in each payam with strategic stakeholders comprising the Payam Administrator, Executive Director, chief, and women and youth representatives. In Kuajiena, the security/military intelligence representative was included in the meeting at the request of the Payam Administrator.

Discussions focused on Policy LINK's community engagement and the specific objectives of the Jur River activities – household and institutional surveys, and the focus group discussions (FGDs). During the meetings, the team answered several community queries, which included questions on the surveys' objectives and recruitment processes. The team also informed the stakeholders of the proposed Enumeration Areas produced by the NBS and inquired about accessibility and security issues in each payam.

## Feedback on the activity and the process

All in all, Policy LINK received positive feedback from the stakeholders in six payams on its collaboration and coordination of activities. The following statements speak volumes about the process:


#### Udici Payam


Payam Administrator: "This will reduce the youth complaints and build confidence with the locals."

## **Strategic Outcome**

The short-term results of Policy LINK's engagement activities can be summarized as follows:

- Approval obtained from the State Governor.
- Security organs fully sensitized/up to speed on Policy LINK's activities.
- Support from the NBS resulted in Policy LINK advancing the cooperation and coordination levels with local authorities and the community stakeholders, which laid the foundation for planned community resilience mapping
- Policy LINK activities approved by the County Commissioner, and team introduction made to all the six Payam Administrators within the county.

# **Challenges encountered**

Overall, the team did not face any significant impediments during the state- and payam-level stakeholder engagements. However, there were some delays in obtaining the Governor's approval to enable Policy LINK to commence with stakeholder engagements. Governor's consent kicks off the activities. This delay resulted in the Public Service Office withholding the endorsement of the job advert, as they required notice of the Governor's consent for Policy LINK to conduct its activities in the state. After two days, Policy LINK received the endorsement from the Governor's office through NBS, which paved the way for the start of the activities.
